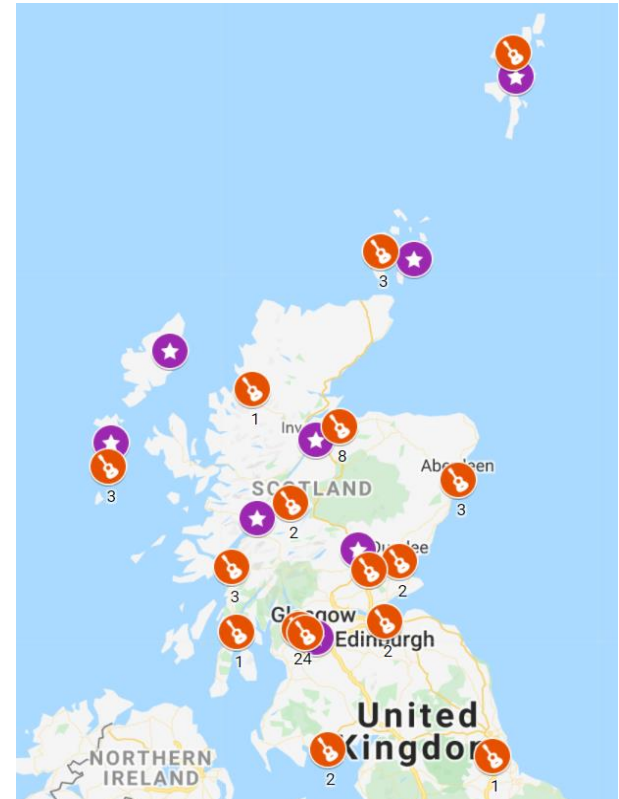

Definitions

Effective: successful in producing desired or intended result

Learning communities: – a cohort of students who share common academic goals.



Challenges

What are the challenges to consider when delivering to and supporting a cohort of students in the UHI context?

Distributed, online, face to face

- Isolation – physical, social – Scottish Rural context
- Social cohesion and sense of community within the course
- Engagement – including the use of technology
- Wellbeing – mental (stressors include employment uncertainty, academic stress, family, finance)
- Nurturing a ‘student experience’ in a distributed online environment

NSS

In the National Student Survey students are asked to rate their experience of



- Teaching on course
- Learning opportunities
- Assessment and feedback
- Academic support
- Organisation and management
- Learning resources
- Learning community
- Student voice

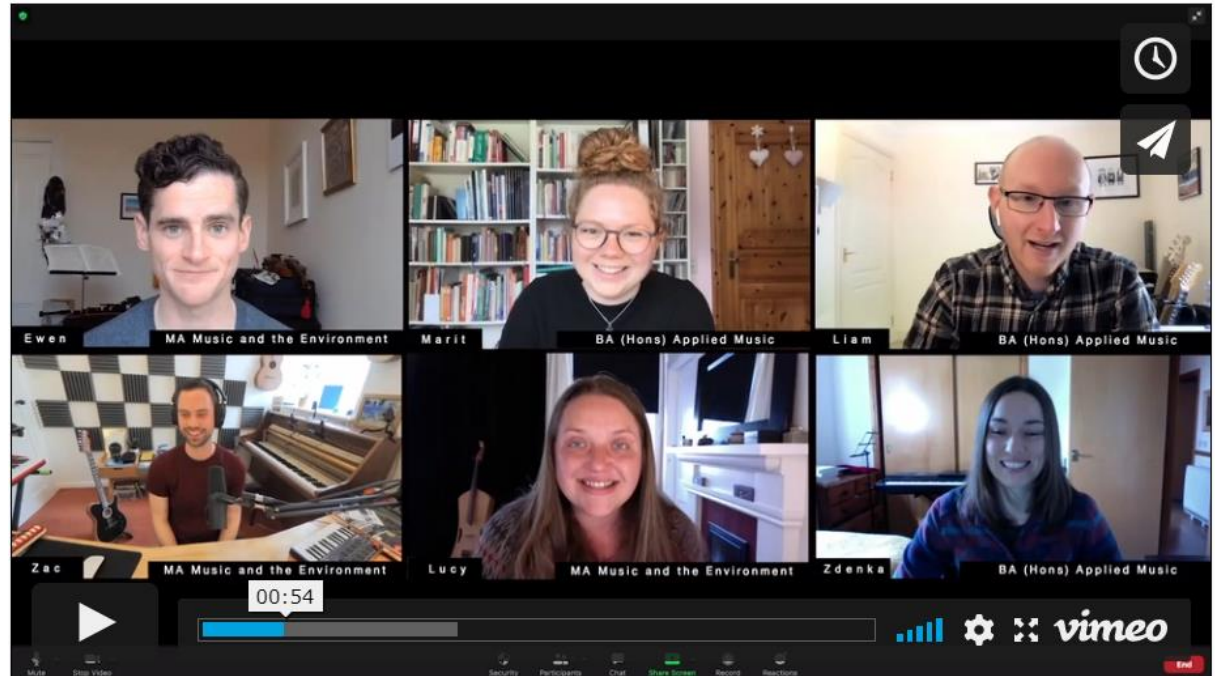

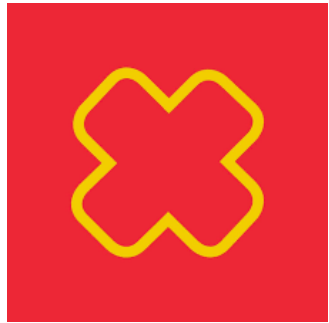

Student Voice

- *“I felt part of a community in which I was encouraged to keep challenging myself and my peers so that we improved together”*
- *“The community of this course has felt like a family and especially during the pandemic, this was essential to get through it”*

Outcomes and Impact

- Retention rates and progression rates at their highest on programme
- Attainment –over 90% of students achieved a 1st or upper 2nd class awards
- Development of leadership and collaboration skills
- Confidence and connectedness – employer engagement and new placements
- 100% in the National Student Survey – 3 consecutive years
- Collaborative Award in Teaching Excellence 2021
