University Deans are first Principal Fellows of the HEA

Dr Gary Campbell (Dean of Faculty of Science, Health and Engineering and Assistant Principal for Curriculum Enhancement) and Michael Rayner (Dean of Research) have recently been recognised as Principal Fellows of the UK Higher Education Academy (PFHEA). Gary and Michael are the first members of the university to achieve this important national recognition, which is awarded to individuals who can demonstrate substantial strategic influence in the development of higher education learning and teaching both internally and within the wider sector. Congrats both!

Gary and Michael successfully secured their Principal Fellowships as part of a wider initiative to help lead and embed the ALPINE framework within the university. Speaking of which...

ALPINE Successes

ALPINE (Accredited Learning, Professional development and Innovation in Education) is the university's framework for the professional recognition of good practice in learning and teaching, learning and teaching support, and educational leadership. ALPINE allows the university to award colleagues Associate Fellow, Fellow and Senior Fellow of the Higher Education Academy (HEA).

Applications for Senior Fellow were considered by a recognition panel in January 2017 and outcomes were communicated in February. Registration is now also open for the next round of ALPINE recognition panels. The deadline for registration is February 15.


Support Portal

The <u>support portal</u> is a brand new suite of resources developed by the Educational Development Unit to support learning and teaching staff. The resources address particular skills gaps identified through working with staff. Topics include 'enhancing the learning environment'; 'finding and using images' and 'creating and using video'. Each topic can be accessed when required and comes with an estimated completion time. Times range from 1 to 10 hours. Like the award-winning Essential Student Skills resource, access is via a url providing staff with the flexibility to locate the resources where they will be most useful.

It is also a facility that colleagues from across the university can use to undertake educational research and development activities, and to run workshops. LTA Scholarships for 2016/17

Each year the LTA announces an open call for university colleagues to undertake evaluation and research projects on topics of interest either within the university, or in the broader field of learning and teaching. This year the LTA Scholarship call was open to proposals for projects in the areas of:

 Institutional Virtual Learning Environment (VLE) review (joint LIS/LTA Scholarship)

- Investigating results from the Student Satisfaction and Experience Survey
- Inclusive assessment practice
